

# The Church of Christ the King FISCAL YEAR '24 REPORT

## July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024

"I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Jesus Christ" (Philippians 3:14).

As the pastor, I get to see the big picture: the youth at the teen Mass on Sunday evening and the elders at the Young at Heart midweek luncheon, the sacramental statistics and the financial statements. With this first-ever annual report, now you can also see the big picture.

This report shows our financial picture for the fiscal year from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024, but it also shows the impact we made with those resources. Who did we serve and how did we serve them? The answers are inside.

Our offertory finally surpassed the pre-pandemic number of \$920K in FY 2019. We're up 1.5%. Baptisms, on the other hand, are the highest in 60 years – you must go back to 1964, the final year of the Baby Boomers, to see a higher count.

To ensure our finances keep up with our growth in membership and ministries, the finance council approved a challenge of a \$1 million offertory. This is a 7% increase over last year's offertory. I thank you in advance for your loyalty to our growing parish!
